## **Our Philosophy**

OAK acknowledges the people of the Kulin Nation, the traditional custodians of the land on which we come together to learn through play. We pay our respects to their Elders, past and present. We respect and celebrate our indigenous heritage.

OAK is committed to providing a child safe environment where children are safe and feel safe, and their voices are heard about decisions that affect their lives. Particular attention will be paid to the cultural safety of Aboriginal children and children from culturally and/or linguistically diverse backgrounds, as well as the safety of children with a disability.

OAK provides a nurturing, secure and stimulating play-based program that is guided by the Victorian Early Years Learning and Development Framework (2016), the Early Years Learning Framework (2009) and the National Quality Framework (2018).

#### We believe:

- In the importance for children to develop a sense of belonging.
- That children are individuals and should be valued for their individuality.
- That children achieve better outcomes when we have high expectations of them.
- In equity and diversity, in that all children deserve to access and participate in all parts of the kindergarten program with other children.
- That every child has the right to learn and develop.
- That all children, families, educators and the Committee have the right to be respected. We promote acceptance and respect for each other's different skills, abilities and cultures.
- That families are respected as their child's first teachers. We value shared decision making and active participation and welcome family involvement.
- In the importance of children making connections with the natural environment and we promote sustainability as part of our everyday practice.

#### **Bush Kinder**

Our 4yo Red group has bush kinder in terms 2 & 3 at Cheltenham Park on Wednesday mornings. We believe that learning outdoors in natural spaces encourages children to explore and experiment, which promotes their development.

## **Additional Day**

An additional day is offered on a Friday to 3yo and 4yo families at an additional cost. These sessions usually start in Week 2 of term one. Additional day classes will only run if there is sufficient demand. Enrolment into these groups is via a ballot system. As this is outside the funded program there is a term fee to attend the additional day classes.

# Proposed Fees for 2026 (per term)

Olympic Avenue Kindergarten has opted in to the "Free Kinder" scheme for 2026. Under this initiative, 3yo and 4yo kindergarten is free for 15 hours per week. Note that we are able to charge the cost of an excursion and also incursions – these will be billed during the year.

There is a \$150 enrolment fee payable when enrolling at the kindergarten, which is non refundable.

Additional Day (Koala) Session: \$900 per term

Plus a \$100 additional day deposit that will be deducted from term 4 additional day fees if you remain enrolled in the additional day program all year.

Families with a Health Care Card, Pensioner Concession card or Refugee status will not need to pay an excursion/incursion fee or an enrolment fee. A deposit for the additional day will still be payable. Please contact our Compliance Officer for more information regarding fees, officeolympicave@gmail.com.

#### **Funded Kindergarten**

Sessional Kindergarten in Victoria is funded by the government for 15 hours per week. In 2026 Both 3yo and 4yo kinder will receive government funding. This funding is paid directly to the kindergarten and does not attract the Child Care Subsidy. The Committee of Management is a not-for profit association registered with Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission. ## **Victorian Government School Term Dates for 2026**

# **Parent Involvement**

Parents are asked to volunteer for kinder duty each term. These sessions are a lot of fun and it is a great way to get to know the staff and the other children in your child's kinder group. Please note that you will require a Working with Children check in order to volunteer in the kindergarten program. We also have an active committee of management which will be voted in at our AGM in November 2025, which is comprised of parent volunteers that manage the service.

## **The Kindergarten Community**

We have a Social/Fundraising Committee, who organise many different activities such as group coffees/dinners, a welcome event, and a social/fundraising night for parents. Our parents also utilise Pennydale park for plays after the kinder session.

#### **Policies**

Olympic Avenue Kindergarten reviews and updates its policies annually. Policies are compiled in a Policy Manual, a copy of which is available for reading in the foyer. #### **Registration Process**

Olympic Avenue Kindergarten participates in the Central Registration scheme operated by Bayside City Council. Registration for 2026 kindergarten must be completed online via Bayside City Council. The registration period for 2026 commences on the 1st May through until 27th June 2025. Offers are then issued to families by email via Bayside Council from the 28<sup>th</sup> July 2025. Note that children must be fully vaccinated for their age in order to attend kindergarten. Places for the kindergarten program within the City of Bayside are allocated according to a number of criteria which are regularly reviewed. Children enrolling for a **3yo** program must **turn three by the 30 April** of the year they attend. (Due to staff:child ratios that are based on age, a child cannot commence at the service until they have turned three years old.)

To Enrol for 3yo kinder 2026 - Born before 1 May 2023

Children enrolling for a **4yo program** must **turn four by the 30 April of the year they attend**. A child may start four-year-old kindergarten at the commencement of the kindergarten year even if they have not yet turned four.

To Enrol for 4yo kinder 2026 - Born before 1 May 2022
